Topic/Subject of the Activity	Waste Management Workshop	
Objectives for conducting Activity	 To educate participants on the detrimental environmental impact of landfill areas. To emphasize individual responsibility in judicious waste management. To promote the adoption of sustainable lifestyle practices. To educate participants on the Tetra Pak Recycling, from collection to product creation. To develop students' understanding of waste management through a participatory segregation Audit activity. 	
Methodology	 The Waste Management Workshop aimed at creating Environmental Awareness and promoting Sustainable Practices. It provided an insight and relevant details about the detrimental impact of irresponsible waste disposal. It enlightened students on how they can follow Sustainable measures in order to tackle the challenge. Students from both SY B.Ed. and FY B.Ed. participated in the Workshop. A resource person Mr. Alden D'Souza delivered a presentation on the environmental impact of increasing landfills. A video presentation was utilized to illustrate the Tetra Pak Recycling process. This included a step-by-step demonstration of how discarded Tetra Paks are transformed into durable sheets through compression and heat application. An Orientation and demonstration of the Composting Bin installed on the Campus was also conducted followed by a Q & A session. 	
Outcome	 It fostered an increased awareness among participants about their role as green warriors in protecting the Environment and promoting sustainable practices. It developed practical understanding of waste segregation technique among the student-teachers. It disseminated knowledge of the Tetra Pak recycling process and its potential for creating useful products. The workshop successfully educated the participants on the importance of green citizenship. It created awareness on the crucial waste management challenges faced in Mumbai. It increased participants' contribution to Sustainable Development by alerting them to their role in Environmental Stewardship.
